<b>Summary Of Duties/Conditions of the Work:</b> <u>Millwrights</u> will work on various projects in a heavy industrial environment. It is an interesting occupation for trade's people who repair and refurbish a variety of equipment used by naval vessels including; Gas turbines, main propulsion systems, mechanical pumps, machinery, winches, propellers, steam alternators, heat exchangers, gear-boxes, high & low pressure compressors. The successful candidate may have to work heights and/or in confined spaces and must be willing & able to wear all associated PPE (Personal Protective Equipment). Successful candidate will participate in safety training related to a Ship Repair Facility.	
<b>Requirements:</b> Must be enrolled in an industrial education class and have a minimum "B" grade average. Good understanding of Math is required. Experience working in the trade outside of school is an asset. The successful candidate must be able to demonstrate a good mechanical knowledge. Assessment will be based on information provided from the resume, cover letter and interview.
