

Dual Credit Policy Messaging

The policy set out by the Ministry of Education and Childcare states that post-secondary dual credit courses must all be part of the same post-secondary credential/program, as outlined by a student's signed transition plan.

Currently, students are limited to one program in their high school career where all post-secondary dual credit courses taken are required for that specific post-secondary credential, connected to a future specific occupation.

If a dual credit course, such as TEAC105, is taken in grade 11, you will not be able to take uStart at UVic in grade 12, as TEAC105 is a locally developed course at Camosun College that does not transfer to the University of Victoria.
